- All Resources: In the tool bar, click on "Presentations" and then provide your name and email address to view presentations, professional development, and parent modules (more will be added soon).

I want to browse and see what the NCSC wiki offers...

- **Search the wiki:** The search feature is in the top right corner of the main page.
 - Type in words, standards, concepts, or topics of interest.
 - A search returns results similar to those of an Internet browser, with key words and titles followed by a few lines from the wiki page.
- View the wiki one curriculum or instructional resource at a time: Click on a resource from the All Resources toolbar (look under Quick Links) or click on the name of a resource on the interactive NCSC Schema (diagram) on the main page.
 - The schema shows how the NCSC Curriculum and Instructional Resources are related.
 - Each resource page begins with short text that answers the questions: How can I use this resource? What will I find in here?

I want to know other tips for getting around the wiki...

- Click on the NCSC logo in the top left corner to return to the main page at any time.
- Click on "All Resources" in the menu under the logo to get back to that toolbar.
- Look for helpful tools in the wiki pages, such as: "back to" links that return you to the primary resources page, recommended resources, and table of contents linked to page sections.
- Click on colored text to see related information in the wiki and on other sites.
