ambidextrous (adjective) – the ability to use both hands with equal ease

audibly (adverb) – able to be heard

chiffarobe (*chiffarobe*)(noun) – a wardrobe and chest of drawers



convicted (adjective) – found guilty

disorderly (*as in disorderly conduct*) (adjective) – offensive to public order

fetches (verb, past tense) – brought

gullet (noun) – throat

heaved (verb, past tense) – lifted

hollered (verb, past tense) – yelled

kindling (*kindlin'*) (noun) – material used to start a fire, such as twigs and small pieces of wood

obscene (adjective) – impolite and immoral

relief checks (noun) – money from the government; welfare

speculations (noun) – assumptions

tedious (adjective) – tiresome because of length or dullness

yonder (adverb) – over there
