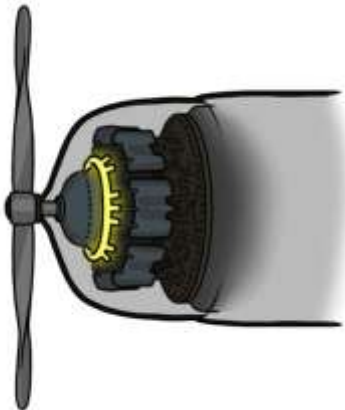
Details from Amelia Earhart (use with Flow Chart)

**That night I ran into a storm.**



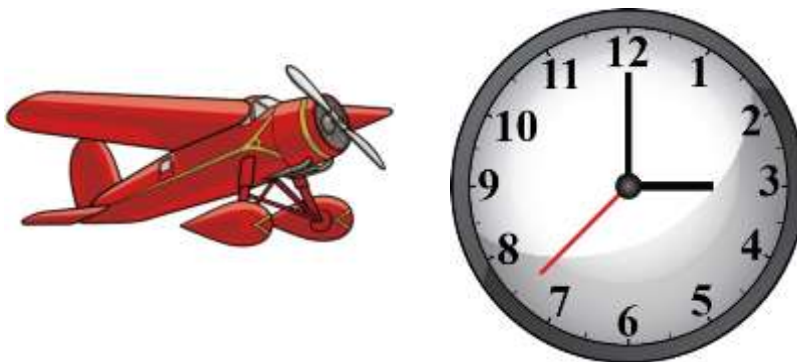
**Then the manifold ring caught on fire.**



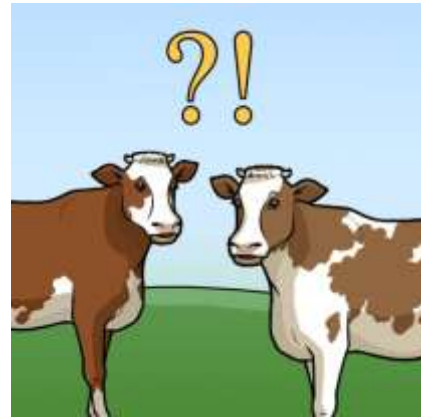
**I needed to land quickly.**
